JACK would like to make sure you “know your odds” when it comes to gambling and has prepared this brochure to assist you.

Casino games and sports betting are forms of entertainment. There are no guarantees, no lucky charms and no special mantras to mumble that will help you win.

Gambling is all about the odds or the ratio of payoff vs. stake. When gambling, the house always has the advantage.

Just like any other hobby, gambling should not be looked at as a way to make money. Guests may develop gambling problems by having a false belief that they will be able to beat the system. However, mathematically, over time, the more you wager, the more likely you are to lose.

Because of the variations in the games and the rules, the house advantage for a particular game at one casino can be greater than the house advantage at another casino for the same game.

Games of skill, like blackjack or poker slightly raise your odds of winning by adding the element of talent. Take blackjack for instance; you are playing only against the dealer. Your goal is to get to a number against the dealer. Your goal is to get a number that beats the dealer’s number without going over 21. However, like every other game, you must remember the dealer always has the upper hand. He is the last to show his hand thus increasing the house’s odds. Bringing it back to the house still having the advantage even against the most skilled players.

Please remember there is really no such thing as a streak of luck. Winning is just a random occurrence. You can be up one moment and down the next. Please be mindful that you should not gamble more than you can afford to lose.
